From the Manager's Desk...

DID YOU NOTICE?

Will Rogers is quoted as saying, "Even if you are on the right track, if you stand still, you will get run over." We at Palmerton Telephone think we have been on the right track in offering the services our customers want at affordable prices. In order to continue doing this, we must remain current with the technology needed to provide those services and the ones that our customers may want in the future.

When a company reaches the limits of the current technology in use, it faces a choice, either move on with something newer or get run over by the competition. We have chosen the former and have moved on to new technology and new service offerings.

Just as when a highway bridge is replaced by a new one, or a road is re-paved, there is a temporary inconvenience, either a detour or a slowdown in the construction zone. It's much the same with a technology upgrade. On the night of April 1-2, 2014 we placed a new processor and switching matrix in service at Palmerton that will replace our late 20th century technology with the latest available. Through careful planning and thorough testing, our staff was able to bring this about with a minimal disruption of services. The cutover was planned to begin at 10:00 PM on the first and be completed before 6:00 AM on the second. The

major portion of the work took place after midnight, so most of you never knew it happened. Customers in Palmerton may have experienced an interruption of about 5 minutes, while customers in the rest of our service area experienced an outage of 15 – 20 minutes. The reason for this was the time it takes software to load and initialize in the new equipment. If you have a computer, you already know that when the operating system or browser wants to do a software update, you can't use that system while the new software is being uploaded and installed. The engineers and technicians from our equipment vendor, General Bandwidth (GEN-BAND), remarked that this was the most error-free cutover they had participated in thus far. This is a tribute to our engineering and technical staff who worked long and hard to see that things were done properly, efficiently and in the right order.

Over the next few months watch for announcements of new services we will be offering to enhance your communications experience.

The "Keep Calm and Carry On" poster was commissioned in 1939 by the temporary Ministry of Information in England, following the printing of two other inspirational posters, "Freedom Is In Peril. Defend It With All Your Might" and "Your Courage, Your Cheerfulness, Your Resolution Will Bring Us Victory." It was intended to be used to strengthen morale in the event of a large attack or occupation, which many considered inevitable at the time. Though more than a million of these posters were originally commissioned, they were kept in storage after the war and most were destroyed. Since the discovery of one in a bookshop in the northeast of England around the year 2000, the "Keep Calm and Carry On" slogan has been reproduced and parodied around the world.

Selective Call Forwarding

Selective Call Forwarding can help you stay in touch with the ones you love by automatically forwarding specific callers to any phone number you choose. Only those calls will be rerouted to your "forward to" number. All others will ring at your home phone as usual.

For just \$3.50 per month, Selective Call Forwarding allows you to forward incoming calls from up to ten (10) telephone numbers within the 610 calling area to another telephone number. Calls made using this service are subject to the regular local or toll charges.

First, if you don't already have this feature, call us to subscribe. Then, when the number of the caller you wish to forward is within the Palmerton Telephone network (most 610-824, 826, 852, 381 and 681 exchanges) you can activate Selective Call Forwarding from your home telephone. If the caller you want to forward is outside the Palmerton Telephone network, simply call our Business Office and we'll set up the forwarding for you.

Please note, toll charges apply when you forward calls to a number outside your local calling area.

Unified Messaging: Voice Mail in Your E-mail

Did you know that Palmerton Telephone offers a FREE feature that allows you to get your phone messages in an e-mail? Unified Messaging sends your Voice Mail messages to your e-mail address, where they appear as a .wav file. That way, all messages are stored in one place, and you have the

choice of listening to Voice Mails with either your telephone or your computer. This great service is available as a FREE feature to all Palmerton Telephone Voice Mail customers, so call today to add Voice mail with Unified Messaging to your phone line.

PenTeleData Webmail

While you're on vacation or simply waiting for an important response, your e-mail will be ready. Just visit www.ptd.net. On the right side of the page, click on "My Webmail" and a new browser window will open. Simply enter your user name and password and you're set! E-mails that you have opened from your e-mail at home or work will not be included, so don't forget to close your e-mail client on your home computer while you're away. (Although this can be changed in the Webmail account settings, you'll also need to configure your e-mail to use IMAP).

Most of us rely heavily on our computers for banking and bill paying, connecting with friends and family, shopping, surfing the Internet and more. We trust them with our personal information and assume that they'll always be secure from any damage or harm, but that's not always true. Attackers can infect computers with malware or malicious software, taking advantage of unsafe user practices, find flaws in your programs to exploit, spread malware, access your information, and change the configurations on your computer for their own benefit.

BE SECURE: Here are some steps you can take to reduce the risks:

Beware of unnecessary default features and software. Intruders can attack your computer by exploiting software weaknesses (vulnerabilities), so it makes sense to know what you have and disable any nonessential services. If these services are enabled in your operating system, disable them only if you don't use them. Research any services you aren't sure about before you disable or modify them, because many are critical to your computer's operation.

Exercise caution when providing personal information, opening email attachments and clicking on untrusted links. Phishers are often the originators of spam e-mail messages—especially the ones that mention a problem with one of your accounts and ask for personal information to deal with some urgent issue.

Safeguard your router. Follow the manufacturer's directions to properly set-up your router and update the firmware. Continue to access updates on a regular basis, since they are usually not automatic. It is also important to change the router's default username and passwords.

Enable and configure a firewall. A firewall is a piece of hardware or software that acts as a protec-

tive barrier between a computer or network and the Internet.

Create strong passwords and change them at least every six months. Avoid using real words or personal information. Choose a longer password over a shorter password and don't use the same one for multiple sites. Use some uppercase letters along with lowercase letters, numbers, and even special characters such as '%' or '@'. (Example: C@mpuT3r)

Use current antivirus and antispyware software. In today's connected world, good virus protection is essential to protect your computer. Just as important as installing anti-virus software, is to keep it current, including purchasing the annual subscriptions. There are several options on the market, but most carry all the same benefits.

Review your security settings, especially on social media accounts. Most social media websites allow you to control your security settings. Be sure to customize these options so that you decide who can see your personal information and posts.

Enable automatic updates. Unless you diligently keep track of operating system updates on your own, allowing automatic updates is an easy way to make sure that you have the most recent security patches.
