






WHAT IS A COMPROMISED EMAIL?

IF IT'S LIKELY THAT AN EMAIL ACCOUNT HAS BECOME SUSCEPTIBLE TO UNAUTHORIZED ACCESS, IT'S CALLED A COMPROMISED EMAIL. HOPEFULLY YOU'VE NEVER BEEN THE OWNER OF A COMPROMISED EMAIL ACCOUNT, BUT IF YOU HAVE, THEN YOU ALREADY KNOW HOW FRUSTRATING IT CAN BE.

When PenTeleData notices that an email account has been hacked/compromised, that means that someone likely has unauthorized access. It becomes necessary to stop that account (and the criminals) from causing further damage to our network or gaining access to other email accounts. The only way for PenTeleData to isolate the incident is to temporarily interrupt service to that email address. Although they take many steps to help protect against phishing, viruses, SPAM, and malware on their email servers, it is VERY important for customers to help too. First and foremost, use current virus protection software and a current operating system on your computer. Then, create strong passwords and not share them with anyone. Last, use caution with an e-mail or pop-up box that asks them

Some customers get angry when their email service has been temporarily interrupted: others understand the dire need to do so. After a recent call to Technical Support, one customer commented on PenTeleData's Facebook page. He explained, "I want to send out a big thank you to this company. Mushroom Pork Chops

Ingredients

- > 4 pork chops
- > salt and pepper to taste
- > 1 pinch garlic salt, or to taste
- > 1 onion, chopped
- > 1/2 pound fresh mushrooms, sliced
- > 1 (10.75 ounce) can condensed cream of mushroom soup

Directions:

Season pork chops with salt, pepper, and garlic salt to taste.



In a large skillet, brown the chops over medium-high heat. Add the onion and mushrooms, and saute for one minute. Pour cream of mushroom soup over chops. Cover skillet, and reduce temperature to medium-low. Simmer 20 to 30 minutes, or until chops are cooked through.

THREE-WAY CALLING

WOULD YOU LIKE TO TALK TO TWO DIFFERENT PEOPLE IN DIFFERENT PLACES AT THE SAME TIME? WITH THREE-WAY CALLING, YOU CAN!

While on one call, Three-Way Calling allows you to add a third person to your conversation without the help of an operator. Best of all, it's a free feature with your Palmerton Telephone Service (although normal toll or long distance charges apply).

If you'd like to make a Three-Way (Conference) Call, here's how:

- 1. Establish a normal two-way call. You can call or be called. This can be a speed call. Inform the person that you are going to put him on hold.
- Press and release your phone's recall feature.
 Depending on your phone model, this may be described as:

Flash – Noted as "Flash" on the telephone keypad.

Hang-up/Answer Button – If a separate Flash key is not available, this may be the same key you use to initiate or end a call.

Hook Switch – This mechanism answers and hangs up a call when you place the handset on the telephone cradle.

- 3. You will hear a short dial tone, a pause, then normal dial tone. The person you were talking to will now be on hold.
- 4. Dial the third party in the normal manner. This call can be a speed call.
- 5. When the third person answers, press the phone's recall feature. The second person is then reconnected to the conversation.
- To disconnect the third person, press the phone's recall feature.
- 7. To disconnect the second person, ask him to hang up.

You can continue adding and dropping third parties by repeating this procedure.

If you have a call waiting feature, you cannot make a three-way call while any caller is waiting or on hold. Call waiting is suspended while a three-way call is in progress.

"Who Just Called Me?" (Beware, Don't Dial Back!)

You've just received a telephone call from an unknown number. The phone rang a few times, but you didn't answer in time and the caller did not leave a message.

What should you do next?

- **A.** Dial back the number on your Caller ID display to see who may have called you.
- **B.** Call back so that you can ask to be put on the caller's "Do Not Call" list.
- C. None of the above.

The answer is C – None of the above! Instead, investigate the number further before dialing it back or simply disregard the call.

Scammers hope that you'll be the next one to wonder about the missed call on your Caller ID display. In fact, they hope that you'll wonder so much that you'll dial the number back. Then, they can charge you for the call AND for each minute that they can keep you on the line. Sometimes, they may just let your phone ring one time - long enough to register the call, but not long enough for you to answer. Other times, you may just receive a text message on your cellular phone, warning you about an injured relative who has you listed as an emergency contact. Even if you aren't charged for the call back, once you've called, they know there's a human on the other end of your telephone number and you can expect many more calls from anyone willing to pay for a marketing list that includes your telephone number. Or, once the caller has you on the phone, they'll use it as an opportunity to phish for your personal information to use for identity theft.

The practice of third parties placing unauthorized charges on accounts is called "cramming". Although any number on the Caller ID display could be a culprit of these scams, they often originate from area codes in Caribbean nations, such as Bahamas, Dominican Republic, Jamaica, British Virgin Islands and Grenada. These include 284, 473, 809, 829, 849, and 876. (There is, of course, nothing wrong with talking to people who live in this area code if you happen to know them. All cautions apply only to solicitations to contact someone unknown to you.)
